Tsjecho-Slowakije 1930. Op een heuvel buiten Praag laten Viktor en Liesel Landauer hun droomhuis bouwen. Een modern vormgegeven huis van staal, glas en natuursteen. Met als blikvanger de centrale glazen kamer, een architectonisch hoogstandje. Als donkere wolken zich boven Europa samenvakken moet de joodse Viktor vluchten voor de nazi's. Het is ook het verhaal van Eisens Tsjechische moeder die Auschwitz overleefde, en die na enig aandringen meegaat naar Praag met haar zoon en zijn vrouw. De optimistische Joodse bankier Julius Petschek liet het paleis na de Eerste Wereldoorlog bouwen als een statement van zijn geloof in Europa, maar overleed uiteindelijk aan een gebroken hart nadat Europa hem, zijn huis en zijn hoop had afgewezen. Tijdens de Tweede Wereldoorlog was er het hoofdkwartier van de Gestapo gevestigd. Geen tuinfeesten, maar marteling en moord. In de laatste jaren van de oorlog was de nieuwe heer des huizes de Duitse kolonel Rudolf Toussaint, die uiteindelijk het paleis en Praag voor verwoesting behoedde. In 1968 volgde de voormalige kind-ster Shirley Temple, dan veertig jaar oud, die het huis gebruikte als podium om bij te dragen aan de Fluwelen Revolutie. Samen vertellen deze levens het dramatische en opmerkelijke verhaal van honderd jaar Europese geschiedenis.
